Virtual Consultative Workshop on Strengthening Social Protection for Workers in New Forms of Employment –The Case of Gig and Platform Workers

March 30, 2021

INTRODUCTION:

The growing diversification of work arrangements has become a distinct feature of current labour markets in both developed and developing countries. While some of the more traditional forms of employment are disappearing or transforming in the wake of automation and digitalization, "new" forms of employment have emerged in various occupations and sectors. (ILO, 2017b; OECD, 2016, 2019a).

These new forms of employment offer opportunities as well as challenges for labour markets. Many of these jobs are found in non-standard forms of employment, having contractual arrangements that deviate from a "standard" full time, employment relationship, which constitutes the key reference point for most labour and social security policy frameworks (Degryse, 2016; ILO,2016a). According to the ILO (2016a), non-standard forms of employment include part-time and on-call work, temporary employment, multi-party employment relationships and disguised employment and dependent self-employment. These new forms of employment often include work facilitated by digital platforms (such as ride-hailing or delivery services provided through Uber, Zomato), and crowd-based work which is provided in a global setting (well-known providers include Amazon Mechanical Turk or Click worker).

The work on digital platforms is often task-based, temporary, and casual in nature, and the boundaries between genuine self-employment and disguised employment relationships are often blurred.^[1] As a result assuring social security to such workers becomes a challenge as many social protection systems operate in traditional employment relationship and are not well equipped to address the non-standard employment.

It has been seen that a large proportion of this work is performed by workers in the developing countries, led by India, which now accounts for about 20% of the total global share. Social protection coverage for workers in "new" forms of employment constitute a major challenge for the future of work and it is for this reason that the ILO Centenary Declaration for the Future of Work discussed the need for a human-centered approach to the future of work, based on Social Protection Floors (SPF) model on ensuring coverage in an universal manner.

It is in this background, the Code on Social Security 2020 which was passed in the Parliament in September, 2020 envisages extending and strengthening of the social protection system by formulating suitable schemes for the unorganized sector, gig workers and platform workers. It also aims to provide occupational safety, health and better conditions by bringing various sections of workers under the ambit of different social security schemes, including life and disability insurance, provident fund, health and maternity benefits and skill-upgradation. By providing access to ESIC benefits for the gig and platform workers, the Code on Social Security targets many of the social security benefits addressed under the ILO Security(Minimum Standards) Convention,1952(No.102) and Social Protection Floors Recommendation, 2012 (No. 202).

OBJECTIVES:

Keeping the above background in to consideration, the workshop will deliberate on strengthening the social protection system for gig and platform workers. The workshop will particularly focus on the following points:

- Features of the Code on Social Security and its implication for social protection of the workers involved in new forms of employment such as the gig and the platform workers.
- Ensuring universal coverage of social protection for unorganized, gig and platform workers.
- Role of tripartite constituents and national stakeholders in extending social protection to the unorganized, gig and platform workers.
